What exactly is O.C.I.A.

In the 1960's, the process of bringing new converts into the Catholic faith was revised. Actually, the Church fathers took it back to the way it was in the early days of the Church. It is a journey undertaken by a person who is responding to God's call to know Him. It is NOT a series of classes regarding the "how to's" of being Catholic. Yes, the doctrines of the Church, the sacraments and liturgical practices are all explained. But primarily, it is a process of conversion of the heart to respond to God's graces. It is really more of an **apprentice experience** where, by example and sharing our faith with them, they learn what it is to have and live a relationship with Jesus Christ.

How much time is required?

We meet every Wednesday from 7:00-8:30 pm in the fireside room of the Parish Office. OCIA sessions begin in October and continue until a month after Easter. In addition, there are several times when we participate as a group in selected parish activities.

Also, beginning in December, participation in the 11:00 am Mass on Sundays is expected.

The topics covered are posted on the schedule given out at the time of interview.

Is there any cost?

There is no cost for the individual.

A Bible and reference materials are provided by St. Edith parish.

What are the Stages of OCIA?

The OCIA is a process in which people are guided and cared for as they awaken in faith and are gradually introduced to the Catholic way of life. It consists of four periods of awakening, growth and formation: Inquiry, Catechumenate, Purification & Enlightenment, and Mystagogy. These stages are marked by three major Rites involving the entire community.

Do I need a Sponsor?

A Sponsor is needed to walk with you on this journey. This person must be an actively participating Catholic who has received Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. You may bring someone you know or St. Edith will gladly provide one for you.
